

Project Guidelines

Before creating a project, you will be asked to agree to some simple project guidelines. For your project to be suitable, you need to:

- be a resident or non-resident member of the College
- agree to deliver any rewards promised to donors
- agree not to overpromise
- understand that we will moderate your project, content and suitability. Each project will need to be signed off by the office and the Development Committee
- note that you may not use ClickHall to fundraise for University Clubs or Societies or external charities – the College itself is a charity
- have a project which benefits Trinity Hall students and the College
- have a Fellow or member of Staff within the College who is aware of and supports your project
- understand that as a *ClickHall Champion*, you and any other individuals (*ClickHall Ambassadors*) you invite to help, are speaking on behalf of the College and should conduct themselves appropriately at all times

- agree that you will commit to seeing through your project to completion

N.B Projects that aim to generate financial profits for the funders or individuals within College are not suitable. The TH Careers Network or our social media channels such as LinkedIn would be a good starting point – we can put you in touch with alumni who might best match your interests.
