- Please create a **single, multi-page PDF file** containing all the pages of your written work plus the cover sheets. So, if sending two essays, your PDF file should include all pages in the following order: Cover Sheet 1, Essay 1, Cover Sheet 2, Essay 2.

Subject	Details
Anglo Saxon, Norse & Celtic	Two recent examples of essays you have written at school, on any subject.
Archaeology	Applicants to all Colleges are required to submit one piece of written work prior to interview. This should be in essay format (not science coursework or a timed exam) with a word limit of up to 1500 words. The work can be extracted from an EPQ.
Architecture	Please submit a PDF (6 A4 pages, and less than 15MB in size) of your own artwork prior to interview. The selection of images should, in part, reflect material you might bring to interview as part of your portfolio. Please name your PDF file as follows: <b>LASTNAME_Firstname_UCAS ID_Portfolio</b> (e.g. BOND_James_0123456789_Portfolio) <b><i>There is no need to include a cover sheet in this case.</i></b>
Asian & Middle Eastern Studies	None, unless you are combining with a European language, in which case please refer to the advice given under 'Modern & Medieval Languages'.
