

# Experiencing Entrepreneurship Award Application Form

#### **Guidance** Notes

Through the Trinity Hall Entrepreneurs Network (THEN), the College is eager to promote innovation and entrepreneurship among its members and support students who are thinking of developing their own start-ups. The Network is designed to promote opportunities for students to be involved with entrepreneurship and to develop a network of alumni to mentor students and recent graduates.

The award is designed to give current students the opportunity to experience entrepreneurship by assisting students who are (i) undertaking internships with start-ups and/or (ii) travel related to enterprise.

Students undertaking unpaid work in a start-up may wish to apply for a grant to help with accommodation and/or travel costs; or students taking part in entrepreneurship activities such as a hackathon may need help with travel costs. It is also possible to apply for a grant to help with course fees for a programme such as EnterpriseTECH and Entrepreneurship Lab in order to gain more entrepreneurship skills.

Applications will be assessed by the Trinity Hall Entrepreneurs Network steering committee, consisting of Trinity Hall members and advisers from the Judge Business School. Maximum awards of £1,500 towards living costs and £1,000 towards travel are possible.

#### Eligibility

To make an application you must be a current undergraduate, postgraduate or post-doc affiliated with Trinity Hall.

Please note applications for grants for working in your own start-up are usually not eligible, unless you can demonstrate how you will receive mentorship and/or learn from others.

Please note students are advised to undertake a risk assessment and are requested to have travel insurance if travelling overseas. Travel to areas against FCDO advice will not be supported.

### How to apply

Applications for the Experiencing Entrepreneurship Award should be made by both:

- i. submitting the application form to THEN@trinhall.cam.ac.uk. Application forms must also be signed by your Tutor. Supplementary information may be submitted alongside the application form.
- ii. submitting a video of up to 5 minutes summarizing your intended project and how it will help you experience entrepreneurship.

Funds will be distributed by the end of each term. Award winners are expected to write a short report about their experiences and what they learned.
