Home students who are studying for their first undergraduate degree and are eligible for public funding do not have to pay the College Fee.

All other students (including Overseas and Affiliated students, and any other students who are not eligible for public funding) are required to pay the College Fee as follows:

This figure will remain the same for each year of your course, provided you do not intermit for more than six consecutive terms.

Maintenance Costs

All students will require a reasonable amount of maintenance money to pay for rent, food and other various living costs. This amount will be higher for students travelling to Cambridge from overseas. Living expenses will obviously vary from individual to individual but the following figures are considered to be a good estimate:

In Cambridge during term time only £11,160

In Cambridge all year round £14,880

These figures include certain college charges such as room rent (as a rough guide, first-year undergraduate accommodation in 2024-25 ranges between £123.45 and £253.35 per week, depending on the size and location of the room). Rents are subject to increase each year.
